RECREATIONAL READING IN THE PARK NATIONAL CAMPAIGN

The 'Recreational Reading in the Park National Campaign' is an initiative in partnership between the University of Fiji and the Ministry of Local Government; in particular Town and City councils throughout Fiji. The campaign was officially launched on Friday 24 January 2025 by the Director, Ministry of Local Government Ms. Bindula Devi to commemorate the United Nations World Education Day. The purpose of this campaign is to draw the community of book lovers, book worms and avid readers in Fiji to a space where they can enjoy both the act of reading in a leisurely manner and within the surrounds of nature. The city and town councils partnered with the UoF to provide the secure parks for the reading campaign to happen every Saturday 2pm-5pm. It is envisaged that a 'community of readers' will naturally grow itself from this campaign. Not only are we raising a nation of readers but more importantly, national thinkers as those who read are known to do much better at school, university, at work than those who don't.
